Fransalian Youth and Fransalian kids is a ministry undertaken by the Missionaries of St. Francis De Sales, Northeast India Province, empowered by the Holy Spirit in molding young Christ-like leaders as instruments of hope and healing to families, society and the world. The ministry to the youth is one of the apostolate of the Congregation. Fransalian Youth Mission flagged off in the year 1995 is the realization of the great vision and hard work of the MSFS Northeast India Province envisioning and realising that there has to be a massive evangelisation and reevangelisation of the youth today. It aims at bringing about a change in the life of the youngsters and thereby in the society. It has already done a lot of work among the Youth through Youth Camps, Leadership training programmes, Awareness response, Animation programmes, Self-employment opportunities, Career Guidance, Teachers training programme, Youth retreats, Faith formation, Evangelization through music ministry, and Music coaching classes.

The ministry visualizes greater growth and development of the youth as well as the society. Illiteracy is one of the greatest obstacles for development. Hence, this ministry among the youth aims at the removal of illiteracy that hampers the development. The target groups of the Fransalian Youth Mission are the School and College Students, Catholic Youth Associations, Youngsters in the different categories, School drop-outs, Unemployed youth, Disillusioned and demoralized youth and working youth.

Today, Relying on the wisdom of this direction, Missionaries of St. Francis De Sales find themselves effective in the evangelisation of the youth.

January - February

A picnic to remember: The most awaited day of the year, yes the Fransalian Youth picnic! It was a bright Saturday morning on the 5th of January, the youth were extremely excited and gathered at the Parish premises accompanied by the Director Fr John went to SFS School Ground our famous picnic spot. All the youth kept singing songs, danced on the floor with great energy on the thumping dance numbers and there were amazing party games. After a tiring and fun packed morning all headed for lunch that triggered hunger and all relished the typical picnic food. Every one enjoyed and had great fun.



Nourishing the faithful: A three day retreat for the faithful of St. Peters Parish, Chandrapur, of Guwahati Archdiocese was organized from 11th to 13th January, 2019. It was really a wonderful blessing for all the retreatants. The program started with the Praise and Worship. The retreat was led by Fr John Barman msfs, Director FYM. He shared about Fathers love, Sin and Repentance, Holy Eucharist, Healing a continuous process through life, Personal Prayer, Word of God. In all around 120 participated.

Teachers Training Programme: On 17th and 18th of January, 2019, a two day Workshop for the teachers of St. Teresa's Englsih Medium School, Rongjuli was conducted by Fr John Barman. The training of teachers focused on



making them better teachers in general. The workshop was creditable and informative. With the help of this workshop, the teachers learnt a lot and also stated that they would surely devise different activities to make ensure a sound teaching- learning for the children as well teacher themselves.

Students Orientation & Career Guidance Programme: Fransalian Youth Mission organized a three day Orientation on the theme Motivation and Career Guidance which is an essential ingredient for staying focused, engaged and fueling the desire to achieve. This program was organized for the students of Classes VIII, IX and X of Holy Cross High School, Borkola, Assam, on 18th February 2019. Approximately 110 students participated.



Parish Sabha: The All Assam Catholic Rabha Sabha was held at Rangjuli Parish, under Guwahati Archdiocese, from 22nd to 24th February, 2019. Rev Fr John Barman was one of the resource persons. He appreciated the community and said that the Catholic Sabha that is active in different parishes across Northeastern dioceses has nurtured leadership qualities among the youth. The endeavour was to provide the fatihful an opportunity to experience closely with due understanding the mystery of Christ. It's a welcome sign that many leaders are striving for the betterment of the community.

March - April

Zonal Youth Seminar at Sonapur Parish: On 2nd March, 2019, at St. Patrick Parish, Sonapur, two day youth seminar was held on the topic Young People, Faith and Vocational Discernment. A few Sessions were animated by Fr John Barman leading teens to a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and His Church.

Career Guidance at St. Paul's Catechetical Centre at Rangia: A two day workshop programme on Career Guidance was organized for the Catholic youth of Guwahati Archdiocese at St. Paul's Catechetical Centre at Rangia on 25th & 26th March, 2019. Around 35 youth participated.

A Veritable Spiritual Treat for Holy Week: St. Margarets High School, Peachlands, Shillong, organized a retreat for the students from 12th to 14th April, 2019, the Friday to the Palm Sunday. There were 300 student participants. Rev. Fr John Barman msfs, preached the retreat together with Jesus Youth who assisted and helped the students to make a good retreat. The preacher was able



to lead the students to a god experience which was shown clearly from all the students approaching the confessional. It was an enriching and very rich preparation of the students to understand and embrace the true meaning of Easter.

Easter Vigil Celebration at Mirem village, Pasighat: On 20th of April the Mirem faithful celebrated Easter vigil mass asserting that the feast of Easter was a joy in the life of every Christian and. The vigil was celebrated by Christians with special fervor. During the Eucharistic celebration, 4 persons were baptised by Fr. John Barman administered to them the "baptismal of promise". And on 21st April, Easter Sunday, or Resurrection Sunday, a festival and holiday commemorating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, Fr John celebrated with the Garo community of Mirem village.



Music Training a Rich and Rewarding Experience: In view of the Annual College Day to be held in St. Clement College, Nagaon, from 23rd to 25th of April, there was a three day music opera training programme for the brothers and sisters of the college. Fr. John Barman in a very fitting manner guided



and trained them for the programme that included music, choir and dance. The performance was laudable and everyone performed well in the function.

Fransalian Youth Convention in Mawkhlam from 26th to 28th April: The Parish Priest of Our Lady of Compassion Parish, Rev Fr Genes Shanpliang msfs inaugurated the Convention. The Inaugural function was also attended by Fr John Barman msfs, Director FYM, who was also one of the resource persons who spoke about the ill-effects of drugs and other illicit substances. Around 140 youth from the Parish took part in a two-day convention which aimed at giving them platform to share knowledge and spread the Word of God as well as to bring change in society.



Strengthening Inter Religious Trust and Respect: Rev. Sr. Justina Kahit msmhc, Diocese Youth Director (Guwahati) along with the parish youth organized a seminar on inter-religious meet to live in peace and harmony. Fr John Barman msfs, the resource

The Priorities, Challenges and Trends in Youth Minsitry were the topics very intricately touched upon.

September - October

North East India Regional Pastoral Conference 2019: The Regional Pastoral Conference 2019 was held from 30th August to 1st September at Don Bosco Institute (DBI), Guwahati. The three-day event, saw the participation of all the Bishops, Priests, Women Religious and around 150 youth and lay delegates from the 15 dioceses of the seven states of North East India, dwelling on the theme "Responsible Youth Leaders for a Better Church and Society" in the context of



the challenges the youth face today and its implications to Society. Rev. Fr John Barman msfs, presented a Paper on 'Profile of a Youth' and Mr Albert Deka, President, Fransalian Youth of Guwahti zone, presented a paper on 'Presence of Youth among Marginalised Youth'. Everyone much appreciated the work that FYM is doing.

Don't we all need a pause from life sometimes? : A three day retreat was preached by Rev Fr John Barman msfs, at St. Joseph College from 12th to 14th of September. The retreat was about resting, resetting and recentering focus on Christ in a way that is without pressure and it was also preached on The Love Of God, Sin and Forgiveness, Worship On Holy Spirit. Around 600 students attended the Retreat and experienced the presence of God in their lives. Many opined that they really enjoyed most everything about this retreat. Students from all faith had attended the Annual Retreat.



Bongaigaon Pastoral Conference 2019: The Bongaigaon Pastoral Conference got underway at Social Service Centre, Bongaigaon on 12th October, 2019. The 2019 edition of one day Pastoral conference was inaugurated by Bishop Thomas Pullopillil, Bishop of Bongaigaon, who gave the Inaugural address and welcomed Fr John Barman msfs, the resource person to speak on "Christus Vivit" to the Priests of the Diocese and to take the discussion on Youth forward. The priest delegates and lay delegates from across the diocese were present and the forum had an honest discussion on way to smooth collaboration of Youth and the Youth Animators.



The Indian Catholic Youth Movement [ICYM] hosted the national youth conference at Secunderabad, October 13 - 17. The importance of the conference was to dialogue and talk in a synodal way, just as Pope Francis asks of the church. "I am the Servant of the Lord; May it be done to me according to your word" (Lk 1:38) was chosen as its theme. It invited youth to understand their call in life and re-affirm their

Commitment to God and His will, in response to all the concerns and matters discussed in the synod, just as the young Virgin Mary did.



Purpose is two ways-to give young people a chance to talk, share and express their thoughts and concerns and the church listens to. Secondly, it is to educate and impart knowledge to young people about faith and important matters in life, such as media, leadership, politics, history of Christian faith, vocation and many other topics in the form of workshops. It is a more dialogue-based programme. The theme this year planned in a way to help young people understand the post synod perspective of a joyful, youthful life and an attempt towards the implementation of the synod to grassroots youth. It was be based on the final document

of the 2018 synod and *Christus Vivit* (Christ is alive). More than 500 youth including invitees and guests are expected to attend this national youth event. Fr John Barman msfs, was also one of the active participant and contributor by way of being Moderator for different Sessions of Discussions

Animation on Leadership for the Bambina Religious Sisters: One day animation programme by Fr John Barman msfs on Leadership was conducted for the Juniors sisters of Bambina Sisters at Provincial House, Manik Nagar, Guwahati on November 21st, 2019.

November - December

It is easy for us to be in this state, but eventually it wears us down. Paul says in (Romans 8:6-8) that to live spiritually balanced is to live life in peace.

With this being said, we can't live so "naturally" that we create idols all around us. Paul discusses in Galatians to live by the Spirit and we will not fall to our sinful nature. We still must go to the Bible whenever situations arise and strive to live like Christ daily. Christ was literally the King of spiritual balance. He was perfectly God and man. He was tempted as we are tempted, but never sinned. He knew the Bible very well and knew exactly what to say to fight off the enemy.

Spirituality is a process of personal transformation, either in accordance with traditional religious ideals, or, increasingly, oriented on subjective experience and psychological growth independently of any specific religious context. In a more general sense, it may refer to almost any kind of meaningful activity or blissful experience. There is no single, widely-agreed definition for the concept. Spirituality can never be taught by anyone The only teacher is your soul. You have to grow from the inside to become spiritual.

Today's youth lives a hectic and pressure filled life. People see a chair and think of it as a piece of furniture. Today's youth struggles to find the purpose of their existence the struggle to find peace and support in this harsh and fast paced world. They have started to lose faith in religion because it never gives them what it promises. They fail to relate to what is preached to them. Depression is rife among the younger generation. People frequently commit suicide under peer pressure, lack of success, lack of fiends, love or satisfaction in what they do. People have lost their will power they can no longer cling to hope, hope that tomorrow might spell the arrival of brighter times. They no longer find the reason for their existence and collapse under the burden they have to cope with everyday. It is here that spirituality again comes in. "I am spiritual but not religious" is the ongoing trend. They no longer want to abide by written rules to approach God, they want to explore find unconventional paths to inner peace and material success. Young people follow spirituality because they want to take their life into their own hands be free to do what they want and whenever they want without any constraints they want to feel responsible for their own life and what they do they no longer want to put the blame of their failures on God nor do they want to give the credit of their successes to Him. They no longer want to box themselves in as A Hindu or a Christian or a Muslim. They believe that when they die, all their accounting will be done to God and then they don't want to walk through a door with a label on it because there is only one God and for Him it doesn't matter which religion you belong to what matters is what you have done in your life. And this is what spirituality actually does, it doesn't teach you about God, it teaches you the fundamental principles of life, gives you advice on how to live and helps you understand the true value of friendship, honesty, love and other qualities It makes you see the brighter side of life, see the good in others and keep your faith in humanity.

Today's youth suffers a lot under depression and stress peer pressure often makes them think that they are useless and just a waste of space they are better off dead so that someone better can take their place. Spirituality calms their troubled soul, gives them hope. It makes them think rationally. It stops people from thinking that they are just a waste of space and are better off dead so that someone better can take their place because it creates a doubt in their hearts: "How do they know that that someone is going to be better than them He or she could be worse for all they know". This gives them hope, hope that God must have sent them into this world for a purpose and that tomorrow might spell the arrival of better times. The Almighty is as perfect as anyone can be spirituality opens our mind, removes evil from our hearts helps us reach the stage where we no longer hold any attachment to this material world and where problems and poisonous words and deeds said and committed by mere mortals can no longer hurt us.

To attain enlightenment we must never approach God with the thinking mind because it may only stimulate our intellectual activities, ideas and beliefs we should try to do so with our crying heart because it will awaken our soulful and spiritual consciousness. Religion, as perceived by us, boxes us in and prevents exploration, experimentation and free mixing between people. 

Youth everywhere reflect their times and since the very beginning, have been filled with confusion, contradiction, a variety of values and indistinct goals. They are struggling to discover where they fit into this puzzle we adults call world.

Often Youth's moodiness, criticalness, giggles, sulkiness and quarrelsomeness, brashness, daydreaming and argumentativeness - all behaviours that tend to irritate adults -signify not character but special needs. Therefore, in the youth ministry there is the need to be deeply sensitive to youth's moods and realize that many behaviors are symptomatic of inner struggles they feel - struggle with forces they do not yet understand. In the process of nurturing the young patience is an utmost need for both youth and those who minister to youth. In the sensitive task of enabling and empowering the young the gentle approach of St. Francis De Sales can be a greatest aid. In dealing with the young he himself had great consideration for them and therefore he reminds that for young severity is not pleasing. Not emotions to be displayed, but quietness and tranquility. Be gentle, gracious, compassionate, simple and good natured, charitable and patient.



Mobilize the community: "Ministry with adolescents mobilizes all of the resources of the faith community in a comprehensive and integrated approach"

Promote cooperation among ministries: "Of special importance to effective ministry with adolescents is cooperation among the leaders, ministries, and programs in a faith community as they work together in a common effort"

Integrate youth within parish life: "We strongly encourage all ministry leaders and communities to call forth the gifts of all young people and empower them for ministry to their peers and leadership in our faith communities"

Involve a wide variety of adults and youth in a wide variety of roles: "This approach involves a wide diversity of adult and youth leaders in a variety of roles. Many will be involved in direct ministry with adolescents; others will provide support services and yet others will link the ministry effort to the resources of the broader community"



Tips to Youth Workers

- 1. **BE THERE:** Your presence matters more than you may realize. Youngsters want to see you among them. Your presence can prevent many mistakes which are fruits of thoughtlessness rather than malice.
- 2. **TAKE THE INITIATIVE:** Wish them, talk to them, smile at them. Don't wait for them to wish you and talk to you.
- 3. TALK OF THINGS THEY ARE INTERESTED IN: Their interests come first not yours, even if these interests seem strange to you.
- 4. **BE FAMILIAR, NOT ALOOF:** Familiarity breeds confidence, and there in no Education without confidence.
- 5. **DON'T IMITATE YOUTH:** Don't try to act like them in language, dress or behavior.
- 6. **BE REASONABLE:** Give reasons for your requests and decisions. Your aim is to develop convictions, not blind obedience.
- 7. **CONSULT THE YOUNG:** Give a hearing to their requests and suggestions.
- 8. **CORRECT, BUT DON'T HUMILIATE:** Correct them gently, yet firmly, when they do wrong. But don't humiliate them in public.
- 9. **DON'T BE CRUEL:** Never makes fun of someone's physical defects, or background, or lack of talents.
- 10. **DON'T BEAT:** Avoid physical punishments.
- 11. **BE HONEST:** Admit your mistakes and accept suggestions and criticisms. Youngsters will esteem you if you do so
- 12. **CULTIVATE VARIETY:** Don't repeat the same way of doing things, whether it is in prayer services or meetings or talks.
- 13. **HELP THEM TO REFLECT:** Don't simply tell them what to do. Ask them to give their views and suggestions.
- 14. **PRAISE THEM:** When they do something well however small the achievement may appear to you.
- 15. **BE IMPARTIAL:** No favorites please, no gifts to special friends, no attention to one or the other or to a few.
- 16. **SEE THE ADULT IN THE CHILD:** See what this youngster can become, with your help. He/she may look raw, immature and hard to be understood. But we need to ask them; what can he/she become? What is he/she capable of?
- 17. **BE PREPARED:** On the problems and questions that concern most youngsters.
- 18. **ENCOURAGE AND DEMAND:** Encourage them in what they can do well, point out what they are good at and demand that they give of their best. If you don't help them to excel, you are helping to destroy them.
- 19. **MAKE THEM RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR FORMATION:** As they grow up, more and more initiative and decisions should be left to them.
- 20. **GIVE THEM CHANCES TO SERVE:** Young people are energetic and generous. They need chances to help, to serve, to sacrifice themselves for a cause.

All these tips can be summarized in one in one principle
The young need not only be loved, but they need to see that they are loved



PRESENCE OF YOUTH AMONG MARGINALISED YOUTH

The Fransalian Youth Movement is an important part of my life. This is where I grew up and was formed; it is my family within the Church. I am happy to share my personal experiences lived in recent years with the Youth Movement.

In the Gospel passage (Jn 20:1-8), John recounts to us that unimaginable morning that forever changed human history. That morning: in the first light of dawn on the day after the Sabbath, near Jesus' tomb, everyone sets off running. Mary Magdalene runs to inform the disciples; Peter and John run toward the sepulchre. Everyone runs everyone feels the urgent need to move: there is no time to lose; they must make haste. As Mary had done - we remember? - As soon as she had conceived Jesus, goes to help Elizabeth.

Yes, we have many reasons to run, often just because there are so many things to do and there is never enough time. At times we rush because something new, beautiful, interesting attracts us. To the contrary, at times we run to escape from a threat, from danger.

Jesus' disciples run because they have received the news that Jesus' body has disappeared from the tomb. The hearts of Mary Magdalene, Simon Peter and John are full of love and beat fervently after the separation that seemed definitive. Perhaps the hope of seeing the Lord's face again is rekindled in them! As on that first day when he had promised: "Come and see" (Jn 1:39). The one who runs the fastest is John, certainly because he is the youngest, but also because he has not ceased hoping after he had seen, with his own eyes, Jesus die on the Cross; and also because he had been close to Mary, and thus he was 'infected' by her faith.

When we feel that faith is waning or is lukewarm, let us go to her, Mary, and she will teach us; she will understand us; she will help us feel faith.

Since that morning, my dear young friends, history has never been the same. That morning changed history. The hour in which death seemed to triumph, actually the hour of its defeat is revealed. Not even that heavy boulder, placed in front of the sepulcher, withstood it. And since that dawn of the first day after the Sabbath, every place in which life is oppressed, every space in which violence, war, misery dominate, where man is humiliated and downtrodden, in that place, a hope of life can still be rekindled.

Dear friends, we have set out on a journey and we have come to this conference. It takes courage to risk a leap forward, a bold and fearless stride to dream and, like Jesus, to realize the Kingdom of God, and to commit our self to a more fraternal humanity. We need fraternity: take a risk, go forward

We need to run faster - attracted by that most beloved Face that we adore in the Holy Eucharist and recognize in the flesh of a suffering brother or sister - May the Holy Spirit encourage us in this race forward. The Church needs our enthusiasm, our intuition, our faith.

Personally, as youth of FYM I have worked with many young people, coming from different backgrounds. We worked with the poorest, with the marginalized. We have included them in our programs, involving them in various activities. This is our way of journeying together with the young people as FYM. We have many ideas and we want to be an active part of the Church. It is nice to know that the Church wants to give young people a voice, knowing our experiences and our point of view.

Jesus said "Learn from me for I am gentle and humble in heart," Mt. 11:29b. Therefore FYM is founded with the intention of building up a civilization of Christian Love through education in Catholic Virtues. We are taught enough to give values to education but education in 'values' is questionable. Paul told Timothy, a youth in the faith, 'Let no one despise your youth, but set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith and in purity.' (1 Timothy. 4:12). God specifically entrusts young people, to be leaders- to lead by example. According to St. Francis de Sales, Youth, if properly educated, are capable of courageous faith and considerable usefulness in the Holy Catholic Church.

Young people are "burning bush" through which God speaks. This strong experience of God can allow us to respond to the cry of the young. We want to be a movement of the poor for the poor maintaining that this is our way of living the Gospel in a radical way and of being more available and prompt in responding to the needs of the young, bringing about in our life a genuine exodus towards the neediest. Migrants, refugees and unemployed youth challenge us in different partsthey invite us to find ways of collaborating and to adopt ways of thinking that are more open, supportive and courageous.

We cannot wait for today's young people to build the church. We need their energy and enthusiasm right now. Pope Francis knew that the youth are very much important in the church ministry, they need to be given responsibility to unleash the leadership and charisma in them. He called Youth that they are "The Now" of the church and the church wanted them to be active and do something to contribute to the church according to their capabilities. The country where all the citizens are working becomes a developed nation. Likewise, the church where all her members are doing their duties as a true follower of Christ makes the church prosper and be more fruitful.

We should inculcate the 'art of giving' among the youth and the happiness that comes with it, be it materialistic, intellectually or spiritually. There is much joy in giving than receiving and as youth we must take risk and not be afraid of offering our service to the church and especially to the marginalised and downtrodden ones. Youth being enthusiastic can do much more work working in groups. It is important to have youth that come together with the same motive and goals of giving something to the church especially volunteering physically (actions) because youth is everybody's prime age and can do much more physically. This is the time that youth need to be guided and nurture in order to become the pillar of the church.

The presence of youth among the marginalised people is very much a good sign of relief and hope for them especially when hope to them seems to fade away because of their past experience. Every person whatever they are, they have something good in them. However, the surroundings around them sometimes killed that seed of goodness silently making way for the evil to take lead and take control of their lives. A good seed planted in a good soil cannot grow to its full potential without being nurtured and taken care of. It is veey much the same with human being, the good in them naturally will be masked and at last engulfed by the evil. Therefore, its high time for the youth ministry to take special care in finding the lost sheep, pray for them, be present with them and take center stage in their life to help them to get back to normal and

being more humane. As youth for marginalised people we should always remember to have patience and trust in God. We will be criticised in many ways in lending a helping hand to those marginalised people and especially when there seems no hope of repenting or recovery back.

In this modern world we find more youth are depressed, especially the educated ones. The lack of job opportunities and insecurity have made them become frustrated and feel like they are becoming burden to their families and thus leading them stay away from the church and civic life. We should be courageos enough to take lead and find solutions or partner with someone who can train and make them skillful in finding something that will make them grow and find their true potential to help them earn and survive and off course doing these by walking side by side with the spiritual care of the church and christian values. And dear fellow youth members let us remember "Faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead."- James 2:17. Never be too shy and selfish to do small things that make someone smile today. I hope that we are brave and be the now of the church to help someone that hides somewhere in the corner and make them to be able to stand up again and be happy and feel being loved.

I end with citation from *CHRISTUS VIVIT*... "Where does Jesus send us? There are no borders, no limits: he sends us everywhere. The Gospel is for everyone, not just for some. It is not only for those who seem closer to us, more receptive, more welcoming. It is for everyone. Do not be afraid to go and bring Christ into every area of life, to the fringes of society, even to those who seem farthest away and most indifferent. The Lord seeks all; he wants everyone to feel the warmth of his mercy and his love". He invites to be fearless missionaries wherever we are and in whatever company we find ourselves: in our neighbourhoods, in school or sports or social life, in volunteer service or in the work place. Wherever we are, we always have an oppurtnity to share the joy of the Gospel. That is how the Lord goes out to meet everyone. He loves you, dear young people, for you are the means by which he can spread his light and hope. He is counting on your courage, your boldness and your enthusiasm.

"You are the Now of God"

Pope Francis celebrates the closing Mass for the 34th World Youth Day in Panama, announces the next WYD venue, and tells young people to keep saying "Yes".

Pope's concluding message to the hundreds of thousands of World Youth Day participants and pilgrims from all over the world can be summarized in one word: "Now".

Not today but Now

"Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing". Taking his cue from the Gospel of Luke, the Pope interpreted that "today" as "now". "Jesus", he began, "reveals the now of God". "In Jesus, the promised future begins and becomes life". Unfortunately, continued the Pope, "we do not always believe that God can be that concrete and commonplace, that close and real". Because "a close and everyday God, a friend and brother, demands that we be concerned with our surroundings". "God is real because love is real", he said.

Not tomorrow but Now

The Pope described the danger of living in "a kind of waiting room, sitting around until we are called". Both adults and young people risk thinking "your Now has not yet come", he said, "that you are too young to be involved in dreaming about and working for the future". Pope Francis referenced last year's Synod of Bishops on Youth, saying it helped us realize that "we need one another", that we have to "encourage dreaming of and working for tomorrow, starting today". "Not tomorrow but now", he said. "Realize that you have a mission and fall in love", said the Pope. "We may possess everything, but if we lack the passion of love, we will have nothing".

Not meantime but Now

For Jesus there is no "meantime", Pope Francis continued. "He is not an interval in life or a passing fad. He is generous love that invites us to entrust ourselves". The Pope invited all young people not to be "paralyzed" by "fear and exclusion, speculation and manipulation". But rather, to recognise the "concrete, close, real love" of Jesus. The Lord and His mission are not "something temporary", said Pope Francis, "they are our life".

The Now of God

At the conclusion of Mass, the Pope thanked all those who have contributed to making this "World Youth Day dream come true" in Panama. But his last words were for the young people themselves: "We are on a journey", he reminded them. "Keep walking, keep living the faith and sharing it". And do not forget, said Pope Francis, that "you are not the tomorrow, you are not the 'meantime', you are the Now of God".

Four takeaways from new papal document



Addressed "to young people and to the entire people of God," Christus Vivit is broken into nine chapters: young people in Scripture, Jesus as a youth, the experiences of young people, a great message for young people, the paths for youth, the roots of young people, youth ministry, vocation and discernment. As is to be expected, Pope Francis quotes heavily from the final document of the synod but also from saints, previous popes - including St. Paul VI, St. John Paul II, and Pope Benedict XVI - the documents of the Second Vatican Council, and also from his own addresses and documents. There also is input from the document that resulted from the pre-synodal meeting in March 2018 with young people.

Here are four key takeaways from Christus Vivit.

Young people are rich in role models.

Be it within Scripture or through the examples of the saints, young people have no shortage of those to whom they can look for guidance. "A wise young person is open to the future, yet still capable of learning something from the experience of others," Pope Francis writes. First and foremost among the examples is the young Jesus himself.

"Jesus does not teach you, young people, from afar or from without, but from within your very youth, a youth he shares with you. It is very important for you to contemplate the young Jesus as presented in the Gospels, for he was truly one of you, and shares many of the features of your young hearts" (No. 31). And Jesus' mother, Mary, "is the supreme model for a youthful Church that seeks to follow Christ with enthusiasm and docility. ... With open heart and soul, she replied, 'Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord' (Lk 1:38)". Pope Francis also highlights several young saints, including St. Sebastian, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Joan of Arc, St. Kateri Tekakwitha, St. Thérèse of Lisieux, Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and others. Pope Francis reminds the young people that while these are models of holiness, each young person is different and called to his or her own path to holiness.

The challenges facing the youth are real. But they find their antidote in three great truths.

Pope Francis also outlines the many challenges that are facing young people today around the world, including "violence in countless different forms," ideological colonization, and the desires, hurts and longings prevalent in today's world. In particular, he highlights the dangers of the "digital environment," migration and abuse, including clergy sexual abuse.

"Thank God, those who committed these horrible crimes are not the majority of priests, who carry out their ministry with fidelity and generosity," the pope writes. "I ask young people to let themselves be inspired by this vast majority." And he added some encouragement: "Ask for the help of the Holy Spirit and confidently aim for the great goal of holiness" (No. 107), adding: "If you are young in years, but feel weak, weary or disillusioned, ask Jesus to renew you. With him, hope never fails".

At the same time, Pope Francis highlights "three great truths that all of us need constantly to keep hearing": that God loves you; that Christ sacrificed himself to save mankind; and that, echoing the title of the exhortation, "Christ is alive!" He continues: "Because he lives, there can be no doubt that goodness will have the upper hand in your life and that all our struggles will prove worthwhile. If this is the case, we can stop complaining and look to the future, for with him this is always possible".

The key to making the years of youth count is friendship with the Lord.

Pope Francis reminds the youth that they won't know the "deepest and fullest" meaning of their early years "unless you encounter each day your best friend, the friend who is Jesus" (No. 150).

"With the same love that Christ pours out on us, we can love him in turn and share his love with others, in the hope that they too will take their place in the community of friendship he established," he writes. "... Friendship with Jesus cannot be broken. He never leaves us, even though at times it appears that he keeps silent" (Nos. 153-154).

To begin and maintain this friendship, Pope Francis encourages regular prayer, which he calls "both a challenge and an adventure."

"Gradually Jesus makes us appreciate his grandeur and draw nearer to him," he writes. "Prayer enables us to share with him every aspect of our lives and to rest confidently in his embrace. At the same time, it gives us a share in his own life and love" (No. 155).

He also encourages young people to mature in holiness and to move forward as courageous missionaries. "You have to discover who you are and develop your own way of being holy, whatever others may say or think," he writes. "Becoming a saint means becoming more fully yourself, becoming what the Lord wished to dream and create, and not a photocopy" (No. 162).

He continued: "He invites us to be fearless missionaries wherever we are and in whatever company we find ourselves: in our neighborhoods, in school or sports or social life, in volunteer service or in the workplace. Wherever we are, we always have an opportunity to share the joy of the Gospel" (No. 177).

Discerning one's vocation is how young people can respond to the plan the Lord has for them.

Pope Francis saves his final advice for the subjects of vocation and discernment. Vocation, he writes to the young people, "is a path guiding your many efforts and actions towards service to others." It is "a recognition of why I was made, why I am here on earth, and what the Lord's plan is for my life" (No. 256). To respond, we must find "our true selves in the light of God and (let) our lives flourish and bear fruit" (No. 257).

In addition to the priesthood, religious life, and participating in work, the pope writes eloquently on the call to family life, saying that our sexuality is a gift from God that allows us to love and to generate life. He acknowledges that, with divorce, separation, second unions and single-parent families, many young people are left with a bad taste in their mouth regarding marriage. But, the pope says, "it is worth your every effort to invest in the family; there you will find the best incentive to mature and the greatest joys to experience and share. Don't let yourselves be robbed of a great love. Don't let yourselves be led astray by those who propose a life of rampant individualism that in the end leads to isolation and the worst sort of loneliness" (No. 263).

When discerning a vocation, the pope suggests young people consider the following questions: Do I know myself, quite apart from my illusions and emotions? Do I know what brings joy or sorrow to my heart? What are my strengths and weaknesses? How can I serve people better and prove most helpful to our world and to the Church? What is my real place in this world? What can I offer to society? Do I have the abilities needed to offer this kind of service? Could I develop those abilities?

"In the end," he writes, "good discernment is a path of freedom that brings to full fruit what is unique in each person, something so personal that only God knows it."






