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Editorial

Advent is the most grace-filled time to prepare ourselves for the coming of our Lord, so that Christmas becomes a real lived experience of receiving Christ into our hearts. When I think of Advent I am reminded of a story narrated by Stephen Covey in his book *Seven Habits of Highly Effective People*. Once upon a time there was a very strong woodcutter who asked for a job with a timber merchant and got it. The wages the timber merchant paid were really good and so were the work conditions. For that reason the woodcutter was determined to do his best. His boss gave him an axe and showed him the area where he was supposed to work. The first day the woodcutter brought 18 trees. "Congratulations' the boss said "go on that way." Very motivated by the words of the boss, the woodcutter tried harder the next day, but he could only bring 15 trees. The third day he tried even harder but brought only 10 trees. Day after day he was bringing



less and less trees. "I must be losing my strength," the woodcutter thought. He went to the boss and apologized, saying he could not understand what was going on. "When was the last time you sharpened your axe? The boss asked. "Sharpen? I had no time to sharpen my axe. I have been very busy trying to cut trees.."

Our lives are like that. We are too busy with so many things, we have no time for our spiritual life. Like the axe that needs sharpening, we too need to sharpen our spirit in this Advent season by becoming more loving, more prayerful, more compassionate, more generous and more faithful. What better gift can we give to Jesus at Christmas than to have meaningfully lived Advent in union with him? What better gift can we give to Jesus at Christmas than to have removed from our lives anything and everything that keeps us apart from Jesus?

Pope Francis in his latest Apostolic Letter, ADMIRABILE SIGNUM-On the meaning and the importance of the Nativity Scene, writes: "In the new world inaugurated by Jesus there is room for whatever is truly human and for all God's creatures. From the shepherd to the blacksmith, from the baker to the musicians, from the women carrying jugs of water to the children at play: all this speaks of the everyday holiness, the joy of doing ordinary things in an extraordinary way, born whenever Jesus shares his divine life with us." (No.6). He further says: "When, at Christmas, we place the statue of the Infant Jesus in the manger, the nativity scene suddenly comes alive. God appears as a child, for us to take into our arms. Beneath weakness and frailty, he conceals his power that creates and transforms all things. It seems impossible, yet it is true: in Jesus, God was a child, and in this way he wished to reveal the greatness of his love: by smiling and opening his arms to all.... As we contemplate this aspect of the nativity scene, we are called to reflect on the responsibility of every Christian to spread the Gospel. Each of us is called to bear glad tidings to all, testifying by our practical works of mercy to the joy of knowing Jesus and his love." (No. 8,9). Thus let us relive the nativity scene in our celebration of Advent and Christmas this year and every year.

Insight: Patience



As we come to the close of **2019**, the Fransalian Family joyfully expresses gratitude for the hope of **rejuvenation** enkindled by the spark of the Divine Spirit guiding our response to the Call of the at the XX General Chapter, 01-13 February: MSFS WAKE UP TO THE BASICS.

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We have sought to re-discover and revive the **Basics of Christian Living**:

- expressed by Jesus, the first Missionary sent by the Father, in his gracious

invitation: "Learn from Me, for I am meek and humble of heart";

- contained in the loving counsel of Mother Mary, our Mother of Compassion, the first Christian disciple and our Patroness : "Do whatever He tells you";
- sounded in the clarion call of Francis de Sales our Patron : "Live + Jesus";
- echoed and exemplified in the life's aspiration of our Founder Fr. Mermier: "I want Missions";

that generations of Fransalians have been and continue to be called upon to emulate.

As we move into the year **2020** that Fr. Abraham Vettuvellil, msfs, our Superior General, has declared: the Year of Fransalian Associates, we rejoice at the prospect of being **revitalized** in our mission, as Fransalians, thanks to a wider networking, a more focused collaboration, and a deeper communion in mind, heart and spirit with individuals, families and groups committed to the Spirit and Spirituality of St. Francis de Sales lived in the exercise of the MSFS Mission.

This Fransalian Mission finds concrete expression in:

- (i) the Apostolate for the renewal of Christian Life;
- (ii) the Apostolate for overseas and pioneering evangelization; and,
- (iii) the Apostolate of education and formation of the young. (MSFS Constitution Ch 2. Our Mission, No.22).

I wish to share with you for your inspiration and emulation some Fransalian Bytes paraphrased: (I) from the *Spiritual Conferences* of our Patron, and, (II) from the *letters* of our Founder addressed to the MSFS, as applicable to our state of life as Fransalians / Fransalian Associates.

These bytes focus on the BASICS of Christian living (in Family / as Religious):

MISSION:

- (I) The Lord expects of you nothing else than that you share in His mission. You will fulfil your mission by proclaiming the good news so that they may have life. They will grow in this life by the good example that you provide them by your own life. Do not be worried whether your efforts bear fruit for you to see. You are expected only to be faithful in working to prepare the barren and arid land. You will only be asked how well you have sown the seed, not how much you have harvested.
- (II) "How happy and contented you are in the performance of your ministry in spite of the countless and constant difficulties that you encounter ... the isolation in which you are obliged to remain so often and for so long, away from your confreres. God adjusts his help according to your needs". His love is our mainstay in this life; He Himself will be our reward in eternity.

CONSECRATION: (Devotion with Committed Focus)

- (I) One may strip oneself of one's garments only to clothe oneself with God. [Col. 3/9-10] Do not live in shame of one's nudity, at the sight of one's weakness but focus on love and confidence in God who is in you and accompanies you on your journey.
- (II) The cluster of qualities which make a missionary (who are filled with the spirit of God, who pray, who study, who mortify themselves, who love their brethren) is rarely found blended together in a single individual; ... to obtain it you have to ask God for it, you have to draw it down upon yourself through a prayer which is humble and full of confidence.

COMMUNION:

- (I) It seems to me that God has chosen you to be receptacles of his divine perfume. You are commissioned to spread he aroma of his Divine Fragrance by the witness of a life a virtue. Thus, along with you many others may benefit, in this life, of genuine peace of mind and tranquility of heart, and thereafter enjoy eternal bliss in the life to come.
- (II) "Imitate the Holy Trinity, that all may be one that they may be one as we are one ... remain perfectly united, at all times showing a warm and cordial regard for one another like brothers who love each other and possess the true zeal of Jesus Christ and of Saint Francis de Sales our glorious and illustrious patron, and who wish to seek nothing else but the greater glory of God, the salvation of souls as well as their own salvation.

DISCIPLINE: (Conformity with the Rule of Life / Constitutions)

(I) For propelling the ship to its Port of Call – destination, what is required of the oarsmen is uniformity, rather than intensity. One may be excused for rowing lazily but rowing out of rhythm is inexcusable.

(II) "Let us carry our Rules in our hands, in our hearts, on our tongue. Let us take up our resolutions and set to work."

The Province of East Africa took one more step forward in the mission of the Lord by taking up a sub-station raised to a parish, in a challenging environment in a short time.



On August 11, 2019 Ibihwa made history by witnessing the triple events: blessing of the new house, official opening of the new parish, and conferring the Sacrament of confirmation for 246 students. His grace Rt. Rev. Beatus Kinyaiya OFM Cap, the Archbishop of Dodoma was the main celebrant of the Holy Eucharist, Rev. Fr. Mathew ThazhathukunnelMSFS, the Provincial Superior, Rev. Chesco CPPS, the Vicar general of the diocese, a number of priests and religious sisters, District Commissioner, District Executive Director of Bahi district and around 3,500 faithful witnessed the event. The parish at Ibihwa being the first mission of Fransalians in the Archdiocese of Dodoma was named after St. Francis de Sales. It has 6 sub-stations and 7 prayer centres, consisting 60 small Christian communities and a total of 7,000 faithful. It is a very promising parish for evangelisation and renewal of Christian faith. We are very grateful for all the support and contributions made by the Province, benefactors, and well-wishers.

was delivered by Fr. Joseph Puliyilakat, of the Southern-African Region. The total number of participants was 19. We were happy to have the guiding presence of the Provincial, Rev. Fr. J.B. Muthuswamy. A well-planned schedule was prepared for the smooth flow of the Colloquium. Each day had a theme in line with our MSFS Constitutions.

Fr. Petrus Tirkey, the outgoing Delegation Superior shared his report. This was followed by reports of the four forums - Mission, Formation, Education and Social-Innovative Ministries. Then the collated report of the questionnaire and the financial report were presented. For the first time, the election of the Councilors/Advisors and Bursar of the Delegation was held by secret ballot. A special session was held to reflect and discuss on the Call of the General Chapter-2019. On the last day of the

Colloquium, Founder's Day was celebrated. A few benefactors of the Delegation were also present for the festive meal.

Martin Luther King Jr. once said; "An individual has not started living until he can rise above the narrow confines of his individualistic concerns to the broader concerns of all humanity." As a community of Jesus' disciples, we the MSFS in Mozambique, have decided to carry on the vision and mission of Jesus actively in accordance with the decisions of the Colloquium-2019. To those who ask the question, "Is there any hope for progress in Mozambique Mission?" our answer is a resounding Yes. In Christ there is always hope. A hope for progress echoing in the hearts and minds of all the members of the Mozambique Delegation.

Fransalians of USA Celebrating 50 Years of Pastoral Presence!

The Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales, also known as Fransalians, working in the United States of America, celebrated 50 years of Pastoral Presence and Missionary activities in the Country. Fransalians began their pastoral ministry in the United States in the year 1969 beginning with the Archdiocese of Atlanta, Georgia. It used to be a Mission Territory of the English Province of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales. We are currently working in 24 Arch/Dioceses spread out in 14 States of the country. There are 71 confreres constituting 14 local communities in the United States.

The year 2019 is a mile marker in our pastoral ministry with the motto "Fransalians Forward Frontiers" as we are celebrating 50 years of pastoral service to the Catholic Church in the United States. A major celebration was held in Atlanta, Georgia from September 9-13, 2019 with retreats, meetings, releasing of Souvenir and Eucharist celebrations. There were about 70 priests in attendance including the Local Ordinary and the Superior General of the Congregation along with several friends, family, well-wishers and parishioners of the Fransalians from Atlanta, Georgia.



In conjunction with the celebrations, we are also planning several major projects to continue the growth and development of the Fransalians in the USA which was formally constituted as a Vice Province in the year 2013 under the leadership of Rev. Fr. Augustine Tharappel, MSFS. The good works begun by the former Provincial and his team, is being continued by Rev. Fr. Tomy Puliyanampattayil, MSFS and his team. The USA Vice Province is continuing its journey as Fransalian Missionaries moving forward to new frontiers as Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales in the USA.
