Pentecost: The coming of the Paraclete

Saint Francis de Sales would say in his Introduction to the Devout Life that the coming of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost was not an isolated event in the life of the Church. According to him, the Holy Spirit continually sanctifies the Church as well as each of her members. The Holy Spirit does this work through tugging on our

individual hearts and by inspirations affecting the life of the Church. The effect of this work is "to strengthen our hearts of his blessings, with his care and fatherly love, to move us, impel us, and draw us to holy virtues, to heavenly love, to good resolutions..." I want to reflect with you, dear confreres, on the importance of Pentecost, presence of the Paraclete for and though the difficult times we are undergoing.

Our Present Predicament

On 31st December 2019 first signs of COVID 19 was reported from Wuhan, the epicentre of the global coronavirus pandemic. On 31st March 2020 the first patient tested positive with Coronavirus in Assam. It took three months for Coronavirus to travel almost 2500 Km to reach Assam. On 28th April, 2020 after four months of fight against the deadly virus, Wuhan, where coronavirus first emerged, cleared all COVID-19 cases. How many months do we need to declare Assam Corona Mukth? Looking at the present statistics in Northeast we know that we are at the beginning and not at the end of a big problem. In spite of the hardships of the present scenario feast of Pentecost has a lot to offer us. Pentecost enable us to do the following;

To Seek New Ways

Coronavirus has opened the humankind to new dimensions of life. The expressions like "good old days" is finding a revamp in these Corona times. Coronavirus has given us new challenges. Corona period forces humans to be seekers, to find new ways, to be adaptive, innovative, creative and inventive. What was impossible is made possible now. What was usual has become weird and what was normal has become abnormal. What was ordinary has become exceptional and what was common has become bizarre. There is a "New Normal" and the earlier one gets used to it the better it is for the proclamation of Christ. "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

To Witness Christ

Pentecost is that event where the impossible becomes possible and abnormal becomes normal. Pentecost is finding the new ways of experiencing God. Pentecost is that happening where God touches one in rare ways. Pentecost is that occurrence where one experience the presence of God massively, immensely and personally. The indwelling of the Holy Spirit in oneself is confirmed when one is innovative, creative and adaptive to witness Christ. "When the Counselor comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who

goes out from the Father, he will testify about me. And you also must testify, for you have been with me from the beginning" (John 15:26-27).

To Be Real You

A spirit filled person is less worried and is not unsure as to how to act and never undermined by fear. As humans there can be some tendencies in us to behave in a selfish or irrational way, but emotions should never override good decision-making process. That is the sign of a person touched by the Holy Spirit. Over spiritualisation of a problem, Coronavirus for example, as a divinely sent plague or simply believing that religious faith alone will protect them from contracting the virus etc. are contrary to the Spirit's ways. The Holy Spirit is the "advocate". "I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all truth" (John 16:12-13a).

To Stay Connected

If Holy Spirit is the wireless connection between Father and the Son then the same Spirit is the internet connection between God and his people. He connects us to God. In Incarnation God communicates with us through Jesus. In Pentecost God communicates to us in his Spirit. This Spirit helps us to stay connected with God. "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and remind you of everything that I have told you" (John 14:26).

To Begin a New Lifestyle

The experience of the coming of the Holy Spirit on fire tongues demands a metanoia; a change of lifestyle. It is a rebirth as it was said to Nicodemus (John 3:1-8). It is a new lifestyle of courage, new orientation and concentration, inspired by the Spirit of God. "Do not worry about how you will defend yourselves or what you will say, for the Holy Spirit will teach you at that time what you should say" (Luke 12:11b-12).

To Pray Earnestly

The Holy Spirit is the 'intercessor' and He will 'teach you to pray' is the promise of Jesus to his disciples. Pentecost is an invitation to pray more. One who does not pray, has to begin to pray and one who already prays, has to pray more. "And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may be with you for ever" (Joh 14: 6).

To Author Good Decisions

Decision making is a process whereas decision taking an autocratic act. Collecting unbiased information is the foundation of a good decision. Sometimes the decision making becomes a very complex, challenging and vulnerable task. Openness to accept the right advice at the right time, seeking the opinions of learned and experienced people, and the personal ability to decide in freedom without being emotional but based on reason are the characteristics of pentecostal experience. The Holy Spirit is the counselor.

To Paraclete: to Intercede

Paraclete, the Greek word refers to a person who came alongside during a time of legal difficulty. The Holy Spirit also acts as comforter or Paraclete, one who intercedes, or supports or acts as an advocate, particularly in times of trial. The Holy Spirit speaks through the prophets (Acts 1:16), He corrects (John 16:8), He comforts (Acts 9:31), He helps us in our infirmities (Romans 8:26), He teaches (1 Corinthians 12:3), He guides (John 16:13), He sanctifies (Romans 15:16) and He empowers (Romans 15:13). The Spirit saws in every Christian the seeds of prophetic words and righteous living to do miracles and testimony through prayer and discipleship.

Please do not encourage guests to visit your place. We have a triple responsibility, do not get, do not give, and do not be a carrier of Corona Virus.
